Hoopsters showcase their skills

Three Mississauga natives attending prep school in the United States will play in the Phase 1 All Canada Classic basketball game tomorrow at the Air Canada Centre in Toronto.

The annual showcase brings together the top male and female basketball players in the country and consists of a pair of games and a dunk contest.

Among those competing in the men's game are Mississauga natives Nick Stauskas, Stefan Jankovic and Naz Long.

Stauskas, a forward with St. Mark School in Massachusetts, has committed to the University of Michigan next year while Jankovic, a forward from Huntington Prep in West Virginia, and Long, a point guard at Findlay College in Ohio, are undecided.

In past years, Canadian stars including Andrew Nicholson, of Mississauga, Denham Brown, Corey Joseph and Tristan Thompson have participated in the event.

The action gets underway with the women's game at 4 p.m. The dunk contest follows at 5:30 p.m. and the men's game tips off at 5:50 p.m.
