Anthony Bennett Breaks Out At 2011 NBA Top 100 Camp

For Anthony Bennett things couldn't be better right now. Fresh off a strong performance at the 2011 Pangos All-American Camp, Bennett earned an invite for the prestigious NBA sponsored top 100 camp.

Rocking #33 Bennett was placed on the Grizzlies squad along side Adam Woodbury.

The two combined for a deadly one-two punch inside, leading the Grizzlies squad to championship glory in one of the most intense and well played games in the camps history.

Indiana and Louisville target Gary Harris of Hamilton Southeastern hit what the game recap called a "tough chance inside the lane," in the closing seconds to lift his Grizzlies to an 82-81 win over the Magic in the title game.

Adam Woodbury captured MVP honors with his 20 points in the championship game. Bennett was rewarded with the "Breakout Performance Award" and was equally impressive throughout the 3-day camp. He hit double digits scoring in all but one of his teams seven games, including a 20 point effort in the first round of the playoff games.

Canadian basketball high school prospect Negus Webster-Chan also participated in the camp and was placed on a stacked Thunder team. He found it difficult to get off shots and went scoreless in two of the teams six games before the thunder bowed out in the semi-finals.

Next stop for Bennett and Webster Chan will be an appearance on home soil at the the 2011 All-Canada Classic.
